Directions:

From I-71 North:

Take I-71 North to Exit 6 (State Route 561/Smith Road/Edwards Road). Take a right at the end of the ramp. The garage entrance for Rookwood Tower is on the right, after J. Alexander's and the entrance to Rookwood Commons.

From I-71 South:

Take I-71 South to Exit 6 (State Route 561/Smith Road/Edwards Road). Turn right at the end of the ramp. Take the first left onto Smith Road (this will become Edmondson Road just before the overpass). The garage entrance for Rookwood Tower is on the right, after J. Alexander's and the entrance to Rookwood Commons.

From I-75 North or I-75 South:

Take State Route 562 East via Exit 7 towards Norwood. Merge onto I-71 South, then follow above directions from I-71 South.

“Social Work Supervision: A Two-Way Process”

Thursday, July 29, 2010

Speaker: Dana Moran, MSW, LISW-S; *Director of Care Coordination for St. Elizabeth Healthcare*

About the seminar: The Ohio Board of Social Work requires that social workers who provide professional supervision possess a set of skills and competencies. Participants will explore the major models of supervision and how they influence their personal model. The dynamics of the professional relationship that includes the supervisor, licensee and client will be discussed as well as the impact of issues related to culture, gender and power. Ethical, legal and regulatory concerns related to supervision will be examined as well as the role of evaluation.

“Overview of the Ohio Nurse Practice Act”

About the seminar: This seminar is designed to give participants an overview of the Ohio Nurse Practice Act. Discussions will cover laws and rules, scope of practice, delegation, boundary issues, discipline and renewing your license. Information will be presented on HIPPA and client safety as well as a comparison on the terms battery, malpractice and negligence. Nurses will leave this seminar with an understanding of Ohio nursing laws.

“Auditory Processing Disorders: What Is ‘That’ All About ?”

Thursday, September 30, 2010

Speaker: Robert W. Keith, Ph.D.; *Adjunct Professor, University of Cincinnati-College of Allied Health Sciences, Department of Communications Sciences and Disorders*

About the seminar: This course is designed for non-audiologist professionals who have heard about auditory processing disorders and are interested in learning more about the disorder. During this discussion we will review some of the controversies regarding definition, assessment and management of APDs. The discussion will include characteristics of a child or adult with APD, definitions of APD, diagnosing, treating and living with APD and similarities/differences with Attention Deficit Disorder and other co-morbid conditions. Finally, case presentations will stimulate discussion of interpretation and recommendations. This presentation is intended to include maximum interaction for question and discussion between the presenter and attendees.

“Cultural Diversity: What Does It Mean to You—Melting Pot or Tossed Salad?”

Thursday, October 28, 2010

Speaker: Deborah A. Smith, Ed.D.; *Leadership Coach for the Promoting Resilient Children Program at Cincinnati Early Learning Centers, Inc.*

About the seminar: This seminar will provide participants with information to increase their awareness of cultural diversity and the importance of understanding their own cultural identity and how this can affect their interactions with families, clients, students, etc. Key terms will be defined and cultural journey exercises will be completed during the seminar. The focus of the seminar is the impact of cultural diversity in the care and education of young children but the information can be generalized to many different groups.

“Still the Best Medicine: Laughter”

Speaker: Chris Barnett, MA ; *Director of Professional and Community Relations & Chief Marketing Officer for Hospice of Cincinnati*

About the seminar: When life throws you a curve ball, try humor. Laughter and humor, appropriately utilized, yield a wide array of benefits. Studies show that laughter strengthens the immune system, relieves stress, improves social connections and can de-escalate intense interpersonal dynamics. Physical, emotional and psychological benefits of humor and laughter will be discussed. Participants will develop personal strategies to optimize the appropriate use of humor and laughter to de-escalate situations in order to help themselves and their clients.

“Update on New Treatments and Devices for Epilepsy”

Thursday, December 2, 2010

Speaker: Tom Koprowski, LSW; *Director of Community Education for the Epilepsy Foundation of Greater Cincinnati*

About the seminar: This seminar will give participants an overview of epilepsy & seizure disorders. A segment of the day will be devoted to recognition of various types of seizures including commonly occurring seizure syndromes. Included will be a discussion of the newest medications to control seizures and some of the promising therapies on the horizon. Special attention will be paid to strategies that have proven successful in reducing seizures among individuals with the disorder. A review of the various medications to control seizures and their side effects will also take place. Plenty of time will be allotted for participation and questions.
